Chair's Report

Welcome to this Annual Report presentation for the 2014 -15 financial year. Another eventful year that was a year marked by a few losses.

Our Director since we reconstituted in 2008, Caroline Downer resigned to take on the role of Executive Officer for Regional Arts North West. The most accurate way of assessing the impact that a leader has had on an organisation is to compare the state of that organisation when they came in to how it looks when they leave. In Caroline's case this art museum is in a much better position now compared to when she arrived in August 2008. She has overseen many substantial improvements in the fabric and activity of our gallery.

During Caroline's tenure, we have seen:

• An increase in annual visitor numbers from 17,000 in 2008 to over 39,000 in 2014

• A revitalized exhibition program which includes many regional artists all the way through to the high profile Archibald in 2013 and coming again in 2015 An online presence including a new website, new branding and online catalogues of the Hinton Collection and Hinton Research Library

• The publication of *Munificence*

• The development of many policies and procedures that have filled a governance void and placed NERAM on a more professional footing • New public programs and a vibrant art class schedule

And over \$700,000 invested for the future

There are many things that Caroline has done behind the scenes to make this a better functioning gallery but I think that the two things that stand out for me are the quality of the exhibitions and the variety of activities for children.

While our new director, Mr Robert Heather had not started until the end of the year covered by this report we offer a warm welcome to him, his partner Edwina and two children.

During the five month period between Caroline leaving and Robert commencing the Acting Director was Christine Durham. Christine ran a tight ship while in charge, fixed a few things that had bugged her for a while and handed over to Robert in early September. Our sincere thanks to Christine for a job well done.

Sadly, the resignation of Dame Marie Bashir AD, CVO, as the 37th Governor of NSW, meant that we lost one of NERAM's most dedicated and passionate Patrons. Dame Marie has visited NERAM many times, she gave us great support behind the scenes and she even hosted a function to thank our supporters at Government House. We thank our continuing Patrons, The Hon Barnaby Joyce MP, Mr Adam Marshall MLA, Dr Philip Bacon AM and Mr Barry Pearce AM for their strong support of NERAM.

The departure of the Café operator NERAM Harvest in April 2015 gave us an opportunity to renegotiate the Crown lease with the Lands Department and the Armidale Dumaresq Council as Trustee so that the cafe area could be included in our lease area and so that we had the power to sub-let that space. We now have a successful new tenant and the whole complex is now within our general control.

Since November 2014 NERAM has a new, upgraded air-conditioning system and building management system which represents a \$250,000 investment in the essential fabric of the gallery. Having the right temperature and humidity is vital and we thank our local Federal member, Barnaby Joyce MP for securing the funding to make this happen from the Commonwealth Government's Building Our Future program. Our contractor Duncan McLean from Armidale Air-conditioning did a great job getting the system installed and functioning with as little disruption to exhibitions as was possible. Duncan also fixed some design faults in the system at his own expense that were well beyond his scope, and we thank him for that.

The NERAM Foundation finished the year with funds invested and it paid a contribution from its investment income to NERAM to support operational activities. I would like to recommend Foundation donations to all NERAM supporters as a way of ensuring that future for our Art Museum is a vibrant one. Thank you to Peter Lloyd for taking on the Chair of the Foundation and Trusts Committee this year.

The Friends of NERAM, ably lead again by Martha Saw, continue to provide great support to NERAM and they are a pleasure to work with. The footprints of the Friends are everywhere. The Catering Queens (and the occasional Prince) prepare and serve food at our openings, the bar is staffed and organised by Friends, fundraising events provide valuable subsidies to gallery activities and the willingness and spirit of the group underpins the warmth that makes the NERAM community what it is.

The Board has been a very effective force in guiding NERAM through the past year. Both Gorm Kirsch and Jane Kreis resigned during the year and we thank them both for the time they gave us, and their ongoing support since leaving the Board. We welcomed Sandra McMahon as a new Board member in April 2015. Sandra is well known in the arts community through her previous role as Director of Tamworth Regional Gallery and now as an owner of the Weswal Gallery and she has been a valuable addition to our Board. My thanks to Steve Gow for his support as Deputy Chair and his work on a few major projects during the year, also to Lucinda Wright and Lou Conway for their help to me in finding a new director. Carolyn Cooper is our own Minister for Finance and we would all be lost without her. Carolyn oversees the monthly accounts, manages the audit process from NERAM's side and gives sound financial advice to the Board. Finally, thanks to the three wise men, Murray Guest, Peter Lloyd and Sam Beasley for their help this year.

To all Board Members, Caroline, Christine, Robert, the hard working Staff of NERAM, Volunteers and those that support us though Friends and Packsaddle I offer my personal thanks for everything that you bring to NERAM both individually and collectively.

Merry Christmas to you all.

Thanks also to the Packsaddle committee, since 1989 they have made over 50 acquisitions for the permanent collection and also provided structural funding for the Packsaddle Studio.

Art Museum Director's Report

Arriving and starting work at a new gallery is always daunting and because the New England Regional Art Museum has such a fantastic reputation it has been wonderful that the reality matched my expectations. It has been great to see the level of community support and interest in what NERAM does, the fine work being done by the volunteers and staff as well as the commitment of groups such as the Friends of NERAM and the Packsaddle artists.

Art museums cannot survive without the support of the people who make up their local community. Everyone can show this support in a variety of ways, by donating funds or by giving their time as a volunteer, their expertise as a Board Member or by just turning up to an exhibition opening or a talk. I cannot take credit for the work which went into the program in 2014-15 here at NERAM but would like to thank everyone involved for helping in their way to make it a successful year.

It was a big year for NERAM with 33,474 visitors attending a program of 31 exhibitions and a range of other activities.

These included:

- *The Art of Wool*: a partnership with Australian Wool Innovation which included an edited catalogue, and will now become a major touring exhibition travelling to Goulburn (NSW), Hamilton (Vic), Tamworth (NSW), Dubbo (NSW), Albury (NSW), Geelong (Vic) and Taree (NSW) with support from the Commonwealth Government through the Visions of Australia program;

- Munificence: works from the Howard Hinton

Collection which was accompanied by the beautiful fully illustrated book published with assistance from the Gordon Darling Foundation and featuring essays by Caroline Downer, NERAM Director and Barry Pearce, Emeritus Curator of Australian Art, Art Gallery of NSW;

- Collection based exhibition such as *The Flowers* of *Hinton, Print and Process II and The Female Nude* which explored the riches of the various collections held here at NERAM;

- An array of works by local and visiting artists including Rowen Matthews, Kerry Gulliver, David Tucker, Fay Porter, Rapheala Rosella, Anna Henderson, Vince Vozzo, Lin Quaife, Vicki Taylor, Michelle Hungerford and Gabrielle Collins, Ray Rixon & Phil Greed, Judy Wilford, David Mackay; - The always popular and diverse Packsaddle fundraising exhibition which encourages the collector in everyone;

- The ongoing partnership with the University of New England and local schools to showcase the talents of local students in the annual *UNE School Art Prize* exhibition;

- Visiting exhibitions from our colleagues at Tamworth Art Gallery (*Utopia Silk Batiks*), and Museums and Galleries NSW (*Striking Contrasts*); and

- Working with the community through groups such as Beyond Empathy, on the *Illuminate* installation and the *Catharsis* project.


Behind the scenes at NERAM was also extremely busy with the implementation of the new software packages for our accounts and shop, the installation of the new air-conditioning plant and the development of the successful *Adopt an Artwork* fundraising appeal and program which received dollar for dollar funding through Creative Partnerships Australia and will greatly increase our ability to conserve and maintain the collections held by NERAM.

NERAM has a strong history of working with the oldest and youngest members of our community and this continued in 2014-15 with the work the gallery did with seniors through its programs as well as with children.

Educational programs at NERAM also reached 726 students from 21 schools across the region and the range of other activities and events at the gallery included exhibition and storeroom tours, workshops and other programs such as the extremely successful debate "Science vs Art".

I look forwards to working with everyone as we take NERAM into the future.

People and Supporters

New England Regional Art Museum is fortunate to be supported by a strong and active community base, ranging from significant stakeholders to committed and dedicated volunteers.

Key Stakeholders

Friends of NERAM plays such a vital role, not only through specific funding for special exhibitions and projects but also in volunteer labour. Their volunteer contribution not only through catering at openings, but at other functions throughout the year, allows NERAM to provide a variety of activities despite limited resources. FON support gives NERAM the opportunity to bring in high quality exhibitions, and to provide specific public programs that specifically meet the needs and interests of its community.

Packsaddle Fundraisers held a successful selling exhibition in October 2014, and continue to support the Museum through acquisitions to its art collections

Margaret Olley Trust continued its partnership with NERAM, donating \$80,082 to assist with staffing infrastructure.

Operational Funding

Armidale Dumaresq Council is the principal source of funding for NERAM's operations, with a service agreement which provides \$314,568.

Arts NSW assisted with an annual grant in 2013 for \$45,000.

The NERAM Foundation also supported NERAM programs and activities.

Project Grants

Project grants allow NERAM to the opportunity to develop special programs. In 2014 funding was received from a number of sources including Regional Arts NSW and the University of New England.

Individual Giving

The circle of community support for NERAM continued to widen. Over the past year we welcomed 58 new donors and supporters – representing in just one year an increase of over 16% to the total donor cohort, through donations ranging from \$20-10,000.

The Adopt an Artwork program alone raised funds well over \$100,000 towards the conservation and preservation of the collection.

Individual donors are a huge support to the gallery, complemented by the many visitors who make non-receipted donations through our 'Entry by Donation' policy, which tripled donations to over \$20,000 during the year.


