<u>Making</u>

VAS2.1: Represents the qualities of experiences and things that are interesting or beautiful* by choosing among aspects of subject matter.

VAS2.2: Uses the forms to suggest the qualities of subject matter.

VAS3.3: Acknowledges that audiences respond in different ways to artworks and that there are different opinions about the value of artworks.
