## Curriculum Links: Early Stage 1

## Making

**VAS2.1:** Represents the qualities of experiences and things that are interesting or beautiful\* by choosing among aspects of subject matter.

**VAS2.2:** Uses the forms to suggest the qualities of subject matter.

#### **Appreciating**

**VAS3.3:** Acknowledges that audiences respond in different ways to artworks and that there are different opinions about the value of artworks.

**VAS3.4:** Communicates about the ways in which subject matter is represented in artworks.

#### <u>Making</u>
