Financial:

Although our fundraising programme was restricted, our membership fees raised income of \$12,705.00. Catering and fundraising contributed \$24,325.20. Friends were able to give \$13,170.00 to support exhibitions and projects at NERAM and a further donation of \$9210.00 from membership fees. Our operating result for the year ended 31 December 2021 was a profit of \$6782.26, compared with the 2020 deficit of (\$7441)

I would also like to acknowledge the personal donation from Friends members Rose and Bruce McCarthy which enabled the refurbishment of the café and the subsequent opening of the Six Counties Restaurant.

Oars Awards

We did not give any Oars Awards in 2021, owing to our restricted activities due to the pandemic.

Membership

Thank you to our membership secretary Merran Pearson for her efficiency and energy. Current membership (including those with Life membership) stands at 300, on 25 February 2022. This is an increase in members from the 2021 number of 254.

Activities:

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic we cancelled NERAMble and the min-NERAMbles in 2021, as well as the High Tea and at-homes. Sincere thanks to all those Friends who had been willing to support these activities and coped with sudden changes of plan and the ambiguity of life under Covid.

The White Rhino Film Club has gone from strength to strength and membership has almost doubled from 60 members to 100 members. We began our year with social distancing in place and films shown in the Mazda Room at NERAM. We were able to shift venue to the refurbished Armidale Playhouse which allowed us to include more members. With John Wearne's warmth and knowledge ably supported by film buff Mike Gibson, we enjoyed a wonderful programme of films., Belinda Hungerford's expertise as projectionist ensured our films operated smoothly - our grateful thanks to Belinda and to Paul Gaddes who has kindly picked up this role. Thanks to the Armidale Dramatic and Musical Society for allowing us to hire the Playhouse at a very reasonable rent.

Friends of NERAM sponsored two workshops by Julie McCarthy (paper conservator) in 2021 and 3 are planned for 2022.

We made an application for a Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grant anticipating a programme of artistic and cultural events to honour our Rural Fire Service and State Emergency Service volunteers. Although we were unsuccessful in our application, I am very grateful to Julia McCosker, Deb McKern and Robyn McCarthy for the time and effort they put into this application.

The Fundraising Committee once again played an essential role in catering for exhibition openings when we were allowed to gather once more and providing catering at every White Rhino film showing. This team works very hard, often in cramped conditions to nourish art lovers and their catering is always delicious, creative and fresh. The first of the openings where we were once again allowed to mingle was in September 2021 and it was a great joy to see the catering team again, full of smiles and energy.
